2017 AGD CONVOCATION ~ LAS VEGAS

In 1951, a small group of dentists created a study club which would one day become the Academy of General Dentistry. These dentists were united in one goal – improving the quality oral care of their patients through their lifelong learning.

Today, AGD continues to offer its members outstanding CE opportunities, important oral health initiatives, professional camaraderie, and organized representation for general dentists across the continent.

Fifty-six years later, that tiny gathering has burgeoned into a powerful national organization numbering over 40,000 members in the United States and Canada. Each year, the AGD Convocation recognizes the perseverance of the Masters and Fellows in their commitments to the profession of dentistry.

One must earn a minimum of 500 approved CE credits to be awarded a Fellowship, in addition to passing a comprehensive examination. To earn a Mastership, Fellows must complete an additional 600 CE credit hours in dental discipline, 400 of which must be participation courses.
