Greetings From Alabama AGD President Toni Neumeier, D.M.D.

With 2017 having come and gone, we now are looking forward to the new year of 2018. Alabama AGD wishes all of you a prosperous year and good health. At this moment, let us review what has happened at national AGD and Alabama AGD in 2017. The goal for AGD is “Whatever your passion, we cater to your unique needs.” There are several implications of the new branding of AGD that was released at the annual scientific meeting in July 2017. The national AGD website is now more user friendly and efforts are being made to further enrich the content found on it. It has five different categories to cater to the various types of members we have: dental students, young dentists, mid-career dentists, experienced dentists and Fellows/Masters; the goal is to address the needs of each member and to encourage more members to be actively involved with the AGD organization. It’s also important to note that multiple CE webinars are offered to members at no charge, and members are given access *General Dentistry* (AGD’s peer-reviewed journal) & *AGD Impact* (monthly news magazine).

Another important impact of the new national website is that it is much easier to link to the Alabama AGD website to search for the current events in our local constituency. I'd like to give thanks to Dr. Derrick Mendez, our president-elect, who has helped relaunch our the Alabama AGD website and helped us earn the Public Information Award for being the first constituent to implement the new AGD branding on our website and other media.

Aside from the rebranding efforts, the other major change at national level is the split of scientific meeting from the governance meeting. Because our constituent has less than 700 members, we only have 3 delegates at the governance meeting. However, it is important to note that for 2017 we have won the **Constituent of the Year** award for our constituent size category, plus the **Academy Constituent Editor's** award and 3 honorable mentions in **Membership**,

Public Information, and **Continuing Education**. This is the result of teamwork from all Alabama AGD members to make us stand out among other constituents. Overall, we have to admit that 2017 was a good year for us.

The annual meeting in Destin this past year was a success; it incorporated changes of location, date, and format of events. We also have received two grants from national AGD to help us initiate our student chapter at UAB dental school. We have 51 D1 new student members. However, due to the increase of member fee from \$ 17.00 to \$ 20.00, which will add some strain to our current financial situation, the board of directors have decided that Alabama AGD will not subsidize D2, D3, D4 student member fee starting in 2018. Currently the student chapter plans to offer free CE courses to students in order to encourage them to participate all AGD sponsored activities and renew their memberships. Whenever you encounter dental students at the upcoming Alumni meeting or other social events please encourage them to renew their memberships.

To continue our success Alabama AGD needs your support; more importantly, we also want to hear your voice. Please get involved and plan to attend our next Alabama AGD general assembly meeting to welcome new officers during the School of Dentistry Alumni meeting on February 4th 2018.

Required Reading: To Accept the OSCE or Not

In March, 2017, the ADA announced the desire to create a national licensure exam to assess a candidate's entry-level clinical skills and competency. The intention was, at the same time, to **avert** the potential ethical issues in **using live patients** for licensure exams.

The exam would be patterned after the example in **Canada**, the **Objective Structured Clinical Exam (OSCE)**. This exam evaluates clinical and critical thinking skills.

Details of the exam—content, structure, and staffing—remain in the works. A steering committee has been created by the Board of Trustees to work out the specifics of content and structure, and to identify the first states or regions for the **“field test.”**

This Board decision came more than a year after the **Council on Dental Education and Licensure** had **recommended** the development of a licensure exam which would **eliminate live patients** from this process.

Currently, only **Colorado** accepts an OSCE for initial licensure, with no restrictions. **Minnesota** has an OSCE administered by the Examining Board of Canada, for the University of Minnesota graduates only.

In the Canadian model, candidates rotate through various stations, answering multiple choice questions, using simulated clinical scenarios and patient situations. The exam is based on “Competency of a beginning dental practitioner in Canada”. It lists approximately **50 skills and procedures** a graduate practitioner must be competent in doing.

Dr. Gary Roberts, ADA President, states, **“The OSCE is simply a new option for dental boards to consider.”** The ADA hopes to have a “Pilot Exam” in states which will accept the OSCE by **2019**. Once the ADA has created the exam, the ADA will license it to states by **2020**.

Your Editor admits a bias on this subject. Having been a General Practitioner in Dentistry for **50 years**, and having served as an Examiner for the Council on Interstate Testing Agency (CITA) for **five years**, I have witnessed a few dental school graduates who are NOT yet competent in performing the two operative procedures required. The Class II and Class III restorations are basic tasks for a practitioner entering the profession.

The American Student Dental Association (**ASDA**) has been “preaching” the unethical practice of using live patients for licensure exams for years. However, clinical dental education requires that students learn their skills with live patients. I see no other way to do this.

A good friend from Mississippi recently told me, at ADA Board Meeting, that he had never had a manikin come to him for treatment!

The current method used by most regional testing agencies is the **“Buffalo Method”** exam. The patients are selected from the schools’ patient pools, and faculty members are on hand to render further treatment if needed. Each patient also must submit information for follow-up care.

Ultimately, individual state boards will have the option to accept the OSCE model or not. Right now, I do not foresee that the Alabama Board of Dental Examiners will jump on board with this type of exam. Time will tell, as it always does.


