

This small device provides concrete evidence that the child needs to be seen by an ENT or an orthodontist and should be a standard feature in all dental practices in the future.

So many people helped behind the scenes. We saw over 421 participants who used the time to learn, network and discuss trends in our industry. This meeting reinforced my belief that no virtual meeting can take the pace of face-to-face discussion at an event like this. As I walked

By the time of the January Alabama meeting, meetings from this partnership will have occurred in Mississippi, Louisiana, Kentucky, and Missouri will follow in March.

Smile Source will provide the speaker and the costs associated with the meeting. A full day of CE (6 hours) will be offered with lunch. The cost of the meeting will be \$199.00 per person. Smile Source will split the tuition with Alabama AGD, so this would be a helpful income to our group provided we gain good attendance. These events have been structured so that Alabama AGD can make a 10-15 minute appeal to non-member attendees on the value of joining AGD and Smile Source will make a 10-15 minute educational announcement about their group and mission statement during breaks.

The Mississippi AGD\Smile Source meeting was held in July of this year and had 50 attendees. Five attendees joined AGD from attending that meeting. Our hope is, our Huntsville as well as many other AGD members will attend this meeting and encourage their non-AGD member friends and colleagues to attend as well.

Did You Know? Origins of the Golf Tee

The next time you Golfers out there tee up that little ball, you can thank **Dr. George F. Grant**, an African American dentist from Boston, for the clever **invention of the Golf Tee!** Before Dr. Grant's invention, Golfers had to tee off on a pinched mound of damp sod.

Grant was born in Oswego, NY, in 1847, and worked for his hometown dentist, Dr. Albert Smith, as a dental assistant. At the age of 19, he left Oswego and headed to Boston, where he found work, again, as a dental assistant.

At 21, he was admitted to Harvard Dental School, the first university-based dental program in the

nation. Dr. Grant graduated with honors from this prestigious program in 1870. Harvard hired him immediately in their Mechanical Dentistry Department. He gained international fame for some of his dental designs, especially inserts for Cleft Palate patients.

Later, Dr Grant opened his own private practice in dentistry there in Boston, enjoying the sport of Golf in his spare time. At the age of 52, on December 12, 1899, he received a Patent for the world's first Golf Tee. His unique invention was actually a wooden spike with a flexible rubber peg on which the Golf ball rested.

Our clever fellow dentist, it seems, was an inventor, but not a marketer, for he never reaped the benefits of his history-changing invention. He simply shared his handy spikes with friends and

Golf partners. When Dr. Grant died, in 1910, of liver disease, his invention died with him.

Another dentist, Dr. William Lowell, from New Jersey, also invented a Golf Tee made of Gutta Percha. In 1991, the United States Golf Association recognized Dr. George Grant as the original inventor of the wooden Golf Tee.


